- 69.9.2 It was suggested that instead of such an itemised scale of charging this should be simplified and the total amount required be paid at agreed times during the year. This approach was not dismissed and would be considered.

Ramp, railings and warehouse extension at Co-op store Still current. Highways have recommended refusal.

EN/03/01417/FUL 8 Lyveden Road. Second storey addition and ground floor extension. Reservations regarding neighbour amenity and positioning up to 8A boundary.

EN/03/01473/FUL 7 Hall Hill. House and garage. Already subject to outline permission no objection

EN/03/1485/1486/1487/FUL/LBC Fermyn Woods Hall. no comment Restoration is obviously necessary and welcome. Most of the detailed scrutiny is specialist. English Heritage and ENC conservation section are involved. Grade II starred listing puts the hall in the top 8% of listed buildings. The setting and group value of all of the buildings are of comparable importance to that of the hall itself. English Heritage has expressed concern to ENC about the pace of the work undertaken before planning consent. They continue to monitor progress. [The floodlighting already installed adjacent to the road will be the subject of a forthcoming retrospective application. Planning permission will be required.]

Proposal Charging policy for use of the meadow 2004/05

Car boot sales

• This to be charged at £50:00 per sale (daylight hours - one day only)

Sporting fixtures (i.e. Cricket and football)

- To be charged at £20:00 per game. Payable at the end of each month.
- No charges to be made for the sports training of the village children,
 i.e. Wednesday cricket sessions that is enjoyed by the village children.

Use by village school

A charge of £100:00 per year to use the meadow for curriculum activities. Payable in one instalment April of each year. Any fundraising etc on the meadow will require permission and be charged appropriately.

Permanent fixtures on the meadow (i.e. buildings)

There will be a ground rent charge of £10:00 per week for any/all organisations with buildings on the meadow. Payable in two instalments. April and September.

Note this charge is in addition to any usage charge i.e. match fixtures.
